In Coldridge, as in parishes across the country, the Nativity Service will form a central part of our Christmas devotions. This tradition can be traced back to a thirteenth century account of the life of St Francis of Assisi, written by St Bonaventure. According to this biography, in 1223 St. Francis got permission from the Pope to build a manger with hay and two live animals — an ox and an ass — in a cave in the Italian village of Grecio. He then invited the villagers to gather round and listen to him preach about the miraculous birth: with St Francis reportedly becoming so overcome with emotion during the devotions that he was unable to say the name "Jesus." The local people believed that the hay used to make the manger had spiritual powers and could cure cattle diseases and pestilences.
